Management of an Investigation

Phases of an investigation

- 1. Planning and Preparing
 - a. Assemble appropriate team (consider technologies, location climate/terrain, complexity)
 - b. Consider a risk assessment
 - c. Appropriate crash kit, equipment, an documentation required
- 2. Initial action at the scene
 - a. Protection of the scene (safety of personnel, barriers, security)
 - b. Mapping the scene / surveying
 - c. Initial contact with witnesses / others
- 3. Identification and collection of evidence
 - a. Collecting evidence, artefacts, samples, and relevant documents
 - b. Complete evidence log and document registry
 - c. Photography of scene / evidence, Registry of photographs
- 4. Interviews with witnesses and other relevant to the investigation
- 5. Detailed examination of the wreckage and/or scene
- 6. Compiling the evidence and preparing report
